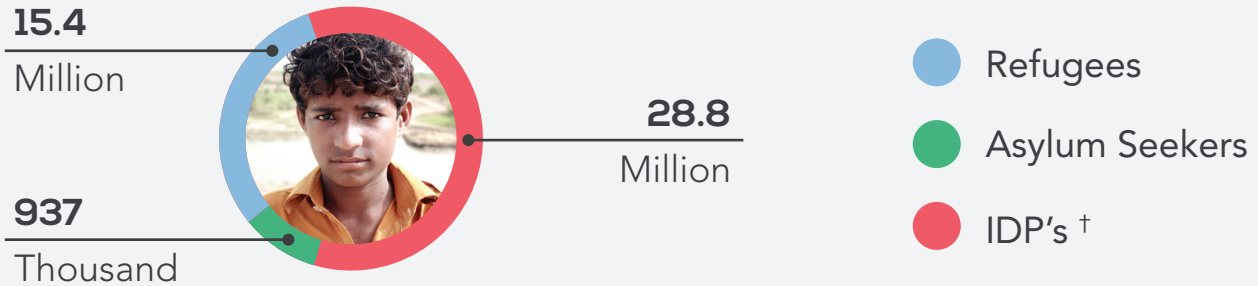

THE NUMBER OF FORCIBLY DISPLACED PEOPLE WORLDWIDE IN 2012



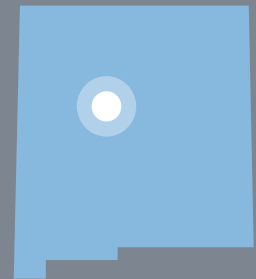
† IDP's, or Internally Displaced Persons, are displaced within the borders of their own country. They are very similar to refugees aside from the crossing of a nation's border.



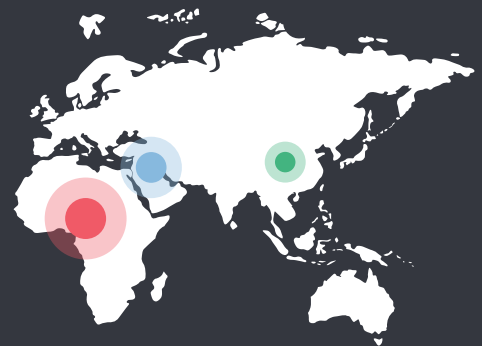
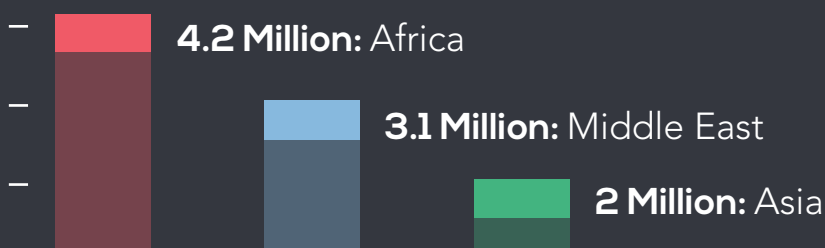
In 2012, 7.6 million people were newly displaced. This figure includes the creation of 1.1 million new refugees. About 8 million are considered Perpetual Refugees.

The world's largest refugee camp is roughly the same population as Albuquerque, New Mexico (500,000), and is in Dadaab, Kenya. 2013 marked its 21st year in existence.

THIS IS ALMOST DOUBLE THE NUMBER OF IDP'S CREATED IN 2011.



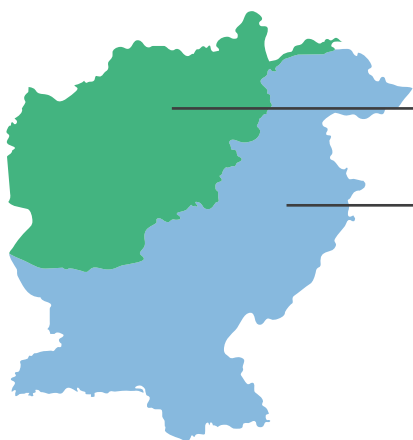
Over 50% of refugees reside in countries with a per-capita GDP below USD 5,000.



Over the year, on average 23,000 people per day were displaced as a result of violence and/or persecution. This is up from about 14,000 per day in 2011.



In 2012, 81% of refugees, or 8.5 million, reside in developing countries. This is up from 70% a decade ago.

At the end of 2012, Pakistan hosted the largest amount of refugees (1,638,500). The majority came from Afghanistan, the largest refugee source in the world (2,586,200).
